The Activity Office will be using Fee Pay an online service, this is how everyone will register for all Sports and Fine Arts going forward. 7th Grade and up, you will need to have a current physical to be able to register and pay, it will not allow you to continue. The Physical Forms will take 24 hours to upload to system. **All Middle School sports fees will be \$100 for 2015-16.**

- ⇒ **STUDENT PLANNERS:** May be purchased from the office for **\$5.00**, The planner includes our school policy information, the 2015-16 school year calendar, this is checked by teachers.
- ⇒ **NEW BREAKFAST OPTION:** Starting October 5th, a yogurt bar will be available as an alternate option for breakfast. Students will be able to grab a cup of self-serve yogurt. Various toppings will be available for students to adorn their yogurt cups. A **main breakfast item** will **still be available if your child does not prefer yogurt.**
- ⇒ **HMS LUNCH INFO:** Cost of a daily lunch @ the Middle School is **\$2.05** Ala carte items are sold at an additional cost. **Breakfast** is also available for students for **\$1.35.** We also have snack bar items available for sale. Adult Lunch prices are \$3.65. If needed, a free/reduced lunch form is available in the Middle School office, Central Office or online at our district website. Our school lunches are set up on a pre-pay system, there are **2 drop off boxes** available for students to drop payments into. **One box will be in the cafeteria** before school each morning, the **second box is located by the Media Center Middle Bus Door.**

GARDEN PARTY

June 21, 22 & 23 | 10 am – Noon | AGES 5 – 8
Instructor: Melissa Ovadje Cost: \$40 all supplies included

Learn through art with this garden themed class. Inspiration from nature will influence children to create a variety of mosaic projects. Children will learn to use new materials while creating unique works of art. Class is led by Park Elementary's art instructor. This class is limited to 12 students.

PRINTMAKING
