
The War With Grandpa


Mr. Nornes—3rd Grade

Through the course of this book students have found evidence supporting their predictions, discovered the author's message, and shared their learning through discussion and writing. Prior to distance learning, students were navigating our upgraded library catalog, called Destiny Discover! They learned how to personalize their browsing experience by






Throughout the month of December, we have been focusing on digital safety/citizenship for 2nd and 3rd grade students whereas 4th and 5th grade have focused on digital footprints. 2nd and 3rd graders heard from a character *Clicky*, about the 4 rules of internet safety (see provided image from NetSmartz Kids). 4th and 5th graders learned how to be mindful of the types of information that they choose to share online. There were wonderful discussions with all grade levels as students shared their experiences and expertise. All Park students will be receiving a bookmark about being a good digital citizen to serve as a helpful reminder of how to behave online.
