

Hutchinson Area Tigers Special Olympics Bowling

We are ready to begin our **11th** season of Hutch Tigers Special Olympics *bowling*! Participation is available for students ages 8 through 21. Mona Hjerpe is our head coach.

Practices will be held at **Hutch Bowl** in Hutchinson on **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, **3:15 - 4:30** for **secondary students**, and **3:30 – 4:30** (or as soon as you are able to arrive) for **elementary students**. Our first practice is **Tuesday, September 6th.** The season runs from September 6 through state competition on November 12. The cost for each student-athlete is \$30. No one will be turned away due to inability to pay.

If your child is **new** to Hutch Tigers Special Olympics, please complete the following: (1) Bowling Registration form, (2) Special Olympics Physical Form and Release, and submit a check for \$30 (made out to Hutchinson Public Schools). **Returning members** with **current** paperwork need only to turn in the registration form and fee. Athletes are required to bring a pair of socks to each practice session; all other bowling equipment is provided (all are welcome to bring personal equipment). Please have your athlete at Hutch Bowl by 3:15 (or 3:30), with arrangements for someone to pick up promptly at 4:30. Parents and/or group home staff are always welcome to attend practices, and are required if the student-athlete is in need of one-to-one assistance.
