

2023-2024 Goal

Our goal for the 2023-2024 school year is to continue to provide an ECS event prior to the start of the school year so 100% of students registered for kindergarten are screened prior to the first day of kindergarten in Hutchinson or another district (records requested as needed to confirm screening was completed).

**Results: 100% students registered GOAL MET**

### **All Students Ready for School**

2024-2025 Goal

Our goal for the 2024-2025 school year is to continue to provide an ECS event prior to the start of the school year so 100% of students registered for kindergarten are screened prior to the first day of kindergarten in Hutchinson or another district (records requested as needed to confirm screening was completed).

### All Students in 3rd Grade Achieving Grade-level Literacy

### 2023-2024 Goal

Increase the percentage of students in grade 3 that are identified as at or above grade level in literacy through the triangulation of data (MCA, Fast-A, CBM) from 66.3% in the spring of 2023 to 71.3% in the spring of 2024.

Results: 52% Goal NOT met

### All Students in 3rd Grade Achieving Grade-level Literacy

### 2024-2025 Goal

The third grade students who identify as at or above grade level in literacy through the triangulation of data (MCAs = meets/exceeds; Fast-aReading = some risk/college pathway; CBMR = some risk/college pathway) will increase from 52% in the spring of 2024 to 57% in the spring of 2025.

### Close the Achievement Gaps Among All Groups

### 2023-2024 Goal

- A. The proficiency gap between the Non-Free and Reduced and the Free and Reduced enrolled by October 1 in Grades 3-8 and 10 as measured by MCA-III Reading accountability tests will decrease from 25.1 % in 2023 to 20.1% in 2024.
- B. The proficiency gap between the Non-Free and Reduced and the Free and Reduced enrolled by October 1 in Grades 3-8 and 11 as measured by MCA-III Math accountability tests will decrease from 29.2% in 2023 to 24.2% in 2024.

Results: A: 25.6% Goal NOT met B: 22.9% Goal MET

### Close the Achievement Gaps Among All Groups

### 2024-2025 Goal

- A. The proficiency gap between the Non-Free and Reduced and the Free and Reduced meeting enrollment criteria in Grades 3-8 and 10 as measured by MCA-III Reading accountability tests will decrease from 25.6 % in 2024 to 20.6% in 2025.
- B. The proficiency gap between the Non-Free and Reduced and the Free and Reduced meeting enrollment criteria in Grades 3-8 and 11 as measured by MCA-III Math accountability tests will decrease from 22.9% in 2024 to 17.9% in 2025.

All Students Career- and College-ready by Graduation

2023-2024 Goal

The number of trimester-long courses failed will be equal to or better than the HHS five-year average (excluding covid affected years) of 470 for the 2023-2024 school year.

**Results: 757 failed courses Goal NOT met**

### 2024-2025 Goal

The number of students that fail two or more courses will be equal to or less than the HHS 3-year average of 127 for the 2024-2025 school year.

### **All Students Graduate**

2023-2024 Goal

Based on the HHS five-year average graduation rate of 86.02 (through Class of 2022), HHS's graduation rate goal for the 22-23 school year is 4% growth to exceed 90.02% of seniors as measured by the MDE graduation data.

Increase District MCA and MTAS proficiency Scores in Reading, Math, and Science from 57.3% (Reading); 53.0% (Math); and 44.4% (Science) in 2023-2024 to 63% or above for Reading; 58% or above for Math; and 50% or above for Science in 2024-2025.

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

- The % of students enrolled in Grade 1 at West Elementary who meet the spring benchmark target score or move to the next highest tier of the FAST CBM-Reading will increase from 73% in the Spring of 2023 to 83% in the Spring of 2024
- Results: Goal Not Met-76% of students moved to the next highest tier of FAST CBM-Reading in the spring on 2024 (Note 10 students missed by 1, would have been 84% with those students)

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

- 23-24 Goal: The percentage of students in 2nd and 3rd Grade at Tiger Elementary who meet or exceed the FastBridge aReading benchmark target score will increase from 70% in spring of 2023 to 75% in 2024.
- Results: Goal Not Met 68.5%
- 23-24 Goal: Increase the percentage of students in grade 3 that are identified as at or above grade level in literacy through the triangulation of data (MCA, Fast-A, CBMR) from 66.3% in the spring of 2023 to 71.3% in the spring of 2024.
- Results: Goal Not Met 52%

#### **SMART Goal**

### DAN OLBERG

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

• 50% of all students enrolled on Sept. 15 in grades 4-5 at Park Elementary who receive Tier 2 or 3 Reading support and are considered "at risk" or "some risk" on the Fall aReading Screener will increase their Scale Score by 1.5 years growth by May 15, 2024.

#### Results:

- 52% of the students in Reading Interventions scored a 1½ years growth in their aReading Scale Score from Fall to Spring.
- 78% of the students in Reading Interventions scored a 1 year growth in theri aReading Scale Score from Fall to Spring.
- 20% of students in Intervention have Exited due to grade level performance. 23% had a over 2 years growth.

### **Dan Olberg**

### **SMART Goal**

The percentage of all students enrolled for at least a half a year in grades 4-5 at Park Elementary who are proficient in all Reading State Accountability tests (MCAs - not MTAS) will increase from 52.9% in 2024 as students in 3rd and 4th grade to 60% in 2025.

Current Data from July 2024 - Does not meet 107/348 30.7%, Partially Meet 60/348 17.2%, Meets 129/348 37%, and Exceeds 52/348 14.9% - this includes all data except MTAS.



### MIKE MCDOWELL

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

- Hutchinson Middle School will increase the overall attendance rate and decrease the number of unexcused absences.
- Results: The overall attendance rate will increase from 94.89% in 2022-23 to ≥ 95.06% in 2023-24 (5 year avg). (NOT MET) Our year end attendance rate was 94.20% (drop of .69%).
- The daily average unexcused absences will decrease from 4.33 in 2022-23 to ≤
   4.00 in 2023-24 (5 year avg is 6.91 which is influenced by 2020-21). (NOT MET)
   Our year end average of unexcused absences was 4.97.

#### **SMART Goal**

HMS will increase the overall attendance rate to

### TIM SINGER-TOWNS

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

 Hutchinson High School will increase the overall attendance rate and decrease the number of unexcused absences.

#### Results:

- The overall attendance rate for 23-24 is 93.61%, which under our goal of beating 94.5 (GOAL NOT MET). The goal was not reached, but showed improvement even during the second half of the year.
- The average daily unexcused absences is 10.83 for the 22-23 school year which did not beat our goal of less than 9.44(GOAL NOT MET).

### SPECIAL SERVICES

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

• The percentage of special education students in grades 4, who are proficient on the 2024 MCA Reading Test will increase by 5% from the proficiency level of the 2023 school year.

#### Results:

- 2023 39 students tested 20.5% proficient (state 23.9% proficient)
- 2024 39 students tested 41% proficient (state 23.4% proficient)

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

- Buildings & Grounds and PRCE will collaborate to complete various projects, maintenance work, and updating and implementing of field schedules and policies to ensure the fields operate at the highest standard possible. This will be a three-year implementation plan.
- Strategic objective is broken up into 5 parts:
  - 1. Irrigation on practice fields (Potentially 3 different projects over 3 summers)
  - 2. Field renovations and maintenance(work completed over 3 summers after irrigation is installed)
  - 3. Create schedules for routine maintenance & field "rest" time
  - 4. Establishing budget dollars for routine maintenance(tracked for 2 years prior to establishing)
  - 5. Updating policies for field usage and rental policies for user groups
- Results: Sprinklers have been installed, and soil improvements have been completed for the west soccer field. This is the only section of the practice fields that remained green this fall! Budget tracking for maintenance is ongoing, and scheduling and policy updates will continue as part of a three-year plan.

### 2023-2024 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

#### Results:

- SOP 2024: Eighty-three percent (83%) of standard operating procedures have been reviewed and updated. This is below the 96% performance measure. Consistent progress was made thru Spring 2024. Significant turnover occurred during Summer 2024, so the process was not finished as planned. However, the procedures that were completed are useful this year.
- Stimulus 2024: Ninety-nine percent (99.1%) of total stimulus expenses were allocated to personnel costs during 2024. This is above the 70% progress goal. Of those expenses, 65% of total stimulus expenses were allocated to programs showing student achievement growth, which is below the target minimum of 96%.
